### A story of commitment and faithfulness

Our congregation's commitment and faithfulness follows the faith move of Maple Leaf

Lutheran Church founders more than six decades ago when they built their church and instituted their ministry, planting a seed that grew into what we are today.

In 2004, the MLLC congregation also made a faith move: to expand our place and extend our mission by purchasing land to build a parking plaza. This was a big move, but we trusted God and stepped out in faith. We planted a new seed, and as it grows today we invite all to join us in loving and serving God and our community.

The contributions from past capital campaigns totaled \$1,130,000 through the end of 2009, with about \$75,000 in pledges still to come from the second campaign. This commitment and faithfulness allowed us to purchase the property, build the parking plaza, and make payments on the loan. By the end of 2009, we had sufficient contributions to pay on the loan through mid-2012. The contributions from our 2010 campaign will provide time to develop additional funding opportunities for retiring the loan.

10% to Endowment Fund to support ministries and programs

Recognizing this, the church council has elected to assign 10 percent of the pledged contributions to the MLLC Endowment Fund to use for programs and ministries. This action will increase the amount available for our ministries to both our congregation and our community and will expand our ability to carry on Christ's work.

The vision of a parking plaza that supports Maple Leaf Lutheran Church outreach has evolved into a site for community events. It is the home of plant exchanges, a p-patch for our SHARE residents, an annual neighborhood barbecue, an Oktoberfest celebration, a fun run fundraiser, and more. The parking plaza is a very visible extension of our outreach mission that already supports such programs as the Lake City Holiday Project, English as a Second Language classes, creek stewardship at Meadowbrook Park, and the Urban Cross Trek summer visits from rural church youth groups.

As we reach out to our neighbors and show God's word at work, we partner with corporations, other faith communities, food banks, civic groups, local community centers, human service providers, other nonprofits, and private individuals. Together, we support families in need, homeless individuals, local schools, and Seattle parks. Our commitments nurture not just Maple Leaf Lutheran Church but our entire community.
